Olympic Games

Every four years thousands of athletes come together to take part in the Olympic Games. It is one of the **biggest** sporting events in the world.

The Games are based on competitions held in Ancient Greece. All <u>fighting</u>, across the Greek world, <u>stopped</u> during the Games. These were part of a religious <u>festival</u> held to honour the Greek god, Zeus. The ancient Greeks thought it was very important for people to exercise their minds, as well as their <u>bodies</u>.

The first recorded Games took place _______ approximately two and a half thousand years ago. In the nineteenth century the modern Olympics were developed to _______ young athletes and to promote peace between different countries.

The opening of the Games is <u>extremely</u> impressive. The Greek athletes lead the procession into the stadium, as a reminder of the <u>original</u> Olympics. The other teams <u>follow</u> in alphabetical order. PrimaryTools.co.uk The Games are officially declared open with the

raising of the Olympic flag. Doves are released into the air as a **symbol** of peace.

A <u>highly</u> significant moment is the lighting of the Olympic Flame, which remains alight <u>throughout</u> the Games.



Several events in the Olympics today, such as running, boxing and <u>wrestling</u>, were also popular in the ancient Games. Some aspects of the Olympics have been <u>transformed</u> by changes in technology. For example, events can now be <u>judged</u> with greater <u>accuracy</u> because of sophisticated measuring equipment.
