

What is a contraction (sometimes known as omission)?

Used instead of letters

- They are used instead of letters when we want to shorten words.
- They take the position of the omitted letter or letters

What is this?

The apostrophe is not where the omitted letter is (wasn't)












Can you think of synonyms for 'possess'?









If it belongs to someone or something add 's (Singular)

The boy's book.

The lady's toilet.

The goose's food.



POSSESION



But what do these mean?

The boys' book.

The ladies' toilet.

The geese's food.









But what do these mean?

The boys' book.

The ladies' toilet.

The geese's food.

They are all plural nouns. If the plural follows normal rules (adding s), then the apostrophe goes after the plural s (boys' not boys's)

If there are special rules for the plural, the apostrophe goes before the s as the spelling a; ready tells us it is plural.
