What does a colon do?

A colon can introduce a list or an idea.

To do well you need three things: hard work, talent and skill.

What does a semi-colon do?

They can separate two main clauses that are related. They can replace connetives.

They will call back tomorrow; we will give them our answer.

Colons can be used to introduce a list or an idea:

A list:

There are many types of trees: oak, cyprus, fir and birch for example.

An idea:

This was what he required: the best of effort from everyone.

If two <u>main clauses</u> are closely related, then you can use a semi colon instead of a connective.

Two related independent clauses:

Some people prefer football. Some people prefer basketball.

Two related independent clauses with a connective:

Some people prefer football whereas some people prefer basketball.

Two related independent clauses with a semi-colon:

Some people prefer football; some people prefer basketball.

If two <u>main clauses</u> are closely related, then you can use a semi colon instead of a connective.

Which is the connective here?

No one was seriously hurt although one man hurt a finger.

The sentence with a semi-colon:

No one was seriously hurt; one man hurt a finger.





Semi-colons can also be used for lists, where each item has a lot of detail:

Weeds may reach the grass in many ways: seeds are blown by the wind; carried by birds; moved by muddy shoes, machinery or tools; or concealed in compost and fertiliser.



A semi-colon can be used to separate two main clauses that are related. Insert a **semi-colon** in the correct place in the sentence below.
