

Prepositions tell us the place or direction of something

for example:

to under

next to after

Can you add any more?



A phrase is a group of words, but not a sentence on its own.

down the street to the shops

over the bridge

PREPOSITIONAL PHRASES

down the street to the shops over the bridge

These are all prepositional phrases because they are a group of words that tell us about place or direction.

The car drove around the race circuit.

Anthony threw rubbish in the bin.

Down the drain, went the rain!

The mouse ran under the table.

A prepsoitional phraze is an example of an adverbial phraze. Adverbs tell us more about the verb (action). Can you also identify the verbs? (V)
